

**Lecturer or Assistant / Associate / Full Professor – Academic Malignant Hematologist**

The Department of Medicine at St. Michael's Hospital, in conjunction with the Temerty Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto, is seeking a qualified full-time academic malignant hematologist with focus on Myeloid Diseases. The successful candidate must be eligible for a full-time clinical academic appointment at the rank of Lecturer or Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor at the University of Toronto. The candidate will have an academic position description of Clinician-Teacher (CT), Clinician-Educator (CE), Clinician in Quality and Innovation (CQI) or Clinician Investigator (CI). The expected start date of the position is September 1, 2024, or shortly thereafter.

The successful candidate will hold an MD degree and should have, or be eligible for, certification in Hematology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO). The successful candidate will also have or be working towards a graduate degree or other advanced training relevant to their area of specialization. In addition, the successful candidate will participate fully in the relevant educational activities, including supervision of fellowship trainees in Hematology at St. Michael's Hospital and the University of Toronto and collaborate in clinical research and quality improvement programs. The successful candidate will report to the Head, Division of Hematology/Oncology at St. Michael's Hospital. The Division currently consists of 12 full time hematologists and oncologists, has an international reputation in clinical research, education and quality improvement, and busy in- and out-patient services. This position will support the current in- and out-patient demands in malignant hematology in addition to supporting the Hematology-Oncology Clinical Research Group (HOCRG). The candidate will have expertise in Myeloid Diseases, as well as a proven academic record of excellence in research, quality improvement or education. As well, the candidate will help lead the development of innovation in care or scholarly work, such as optimizing chemotherapy delivery or multidisciplinary care, clinical trials, hematology training approaches or curriculum development.

Estimated remuneration will be commensurate with academic rank, qualifications and experience, in addition to a COMET AFP (Community Oncologists of Metropolitan Toronto Alternate Funding Plan) funded position.
